### **Regulations**

- 1 Title**  
These regulations are the Fisheries (Auckland and Kermadec Areas Amateur Fishing) Amendment Regulations 2012.

**2 Commencement**

These regulations come into force on 1 May 2012.

**3 Principal regulations**

These regulations amend the Fisheries (Auckland and Kermadec Areas Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986 (the **principal regulations**).

**4 Regulation 3A amended (Maximum daily number of fish)**

After regulation 3A(2), insert:

“(2A) No person may, on any day,—

“(a) take from within the Auckland fishery management area more than 5 bluenose; or

“(b) possess more than 5 bluenose in that area; or

“(c) possess more than 5 bluenose taken from within that area.”

**Explanatory note**

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 1 May 2012, amend the Fisheries (Auckland and Kermadec Areas Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986.

The amendment provides that 5 is the maximum daily number for bluenose in relation to the Auckland fishery management area.
